We are happy to invite you into joining us through a psychoanalytical discussion focusing on the causes and effects of a most interesting state of the psyche – boredom. As Alexander Uskov said, psychoanalysis came into being on the verge of centuries as response to the existential challenge of boredom, lack of vividness, and withdrawal from the understanding and loving other.

Psychoanalysis has celebrated its 100th anniversary, and we are stepping on another verge of centuries. Human life goes on rushing in between suffering and boredom. Is there any difference between the boredom we perceive through the eyes of our patients – youngsters considering a suicide, and the melancholy that Schopenhauer and Chekhov described? What can we get from the boredom observed in a psychoanalytical office or in a medical institution? Nikolay Uspensky has a line in one of his works, which goes like: “Wilderness and boredom reigned in the hospital, and there was nearly no other conversation but about the doctor and the soup served for lunch”.

Bernstein, Wong, Peters among other analysts describing boredom suggest treating this mental phenomenon just like any other symptom, wondering about the conflicting forces triggering.

We get bored when we have to put aside or abandon an interesting activity. During that, someone having to stay for a week in a summer house at the sea and missing sunrays would have an inner mental image whole different from that of a person who had to leave his or her beloved one.

Boredom (sorry for the Oxymoron here), is an extremely interesting and comprehensive thing. The veil of boredom will always have behind a secret, a mystery, which may be terribly fascinating to solve.
